June 28 - August 14





The final exhibit in our Mashpee location was our third annual "Small Works" show, which is a wonderful fundraiser both for local Cape artists and for the Cahoon. More than thirty artists participated this year, and their works had an obvious and widespread appeal. The exhibit drew a constant stream of visitors; the opening reception was a gala event with many of the artists present in person; and we are proud to announce that we sold eleven of the works. Once again the exhibit proved an excellent venue both for viewing fine art and for holiday shopping!

shepherded the Cahoon through

FROM THE DIRECTOR ... Richard Waterhouse

A Fond Farewell

I sit here writing my final director's letter realizing how much we have accomplished together in the past five years.

We have finished an incredible renovation and new building that will allow so many more people to enjoy the museum.

Every time I visit the new space, I am just amazed how much we now have accomplished.

have accomplished including a well-lit exhibition space, a sleek lobby with a great gift shop area, state of the art storage where we can properly store our fabulous permanent collection, accessible bathrooms and an elevator that will take mobility impaired visitors to the second floor of the house so they can enjoy that space as well. One person that has been the leader of this renovation and new addition has been Jason Eldredge who has calmly navigated us through many storms to get us to our final destination which is the renovation and new building.

We have presented over five years of quality programming bringing in new audiences and trying new events. Some exhibitions that come to mind are: Mighty Ships and Their Journeys to the Beyond; Lone Figure and the Landscape; A Family of Artists: Gruppé Family; Italia: The Influence of Italy on American Artists; Magnificent Splendor of Trees; In Praise of Women: How Women are Portrayed in American

Art; Lure of the Fish; Awe of the Spires; Commerce and the Sea: A Celebration of Antonio Jacobsen; and Wallace Nutting and the Colonial Revival Movement.

Some of the innovative programming that we have tried include a book club where we read a book related to the current exhibition; lectures and demonstrations related to the exhibitions; and even board members' presentation about the permanent collection. Thanks to so many of you who attended the events and were so supportive of the exhibitions.

We successfully coordinated and ran a satellite museum at Mashpee Commons for almost two years. We could not have done that without the support of Buff Chase, owner of Mashpee Commons. We have increased our visitor base and I hope many of those visitors will follow us back to Cotuit.

Thanks to the Cahoon Society, we have added six outstanding works to the permanent collection including: Salt Creek, Cape Cod by Margaret J. Patterson (1867-1950); Doorway by Walter Gay (1856-1937); Nonquitt Marshes by R. Swain Gifford (1840-1905);Provincetown Dunes by Daisy Marguerite Hughes (1882-1968); Skating in New England by Martha Cahoon (1905-1999); and Whitehead Rock.

Cohassett Harbor, Massachusetts, 1885, by Frank Shapleigh (1842-1906). We had many of them of up for the permanent collection exhibition that just closed and they are outstanding.

We have set up an exceptional volunteer committee which includes Maribeth Bonington, Mary Ethel Grady, Fay Rogers, Marie Scales and Jeffrey Wilson. Together, we have done some great trips to the Peabody Essex Museum, Newport Art Museum and the Harvard Art Museums. We also rewrote the volunteer manual which is now ready for the new opening.

Thanks so much for your support of me for the past five years. We should all be very proud of all we have accomplished together.

You know I love quotes so I will end with one: "Creativity takes courage" – Henri Matisse.
